<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applied for the Platinum Award, School Games Mark after achieving Gold Award.</li><li>• Profile of PE is exceptionally high, with over 60% of pupils representing the school at out of school events.</li><li>• Various CPD opportunities varying from tag rugby, cricket, gymnastics, striking and fielding games and athletics.</li><li>• Previous inactive pupils have enjoyed an Active Life Club and a day out at an activity centre – since, some have joined after school clubs.</li><li>• Culture of skipping and physical activity at break and lunch time.</li><li>• Swimming progress in key stage two has been extremely high, with over 70% of year sixes reaching the 25m award with many previously struggling to swim 5m.</li><li>• Community links with Bristol Sport, Forever Sport, Bristol Rovers Community Trust, Starlight Cheerleading, Gloucestershire Cricket Dynamos and many local clubs too – all delivering sessions and programmes in school to give our pupils wonderful experiences around well-being and physical activity.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To incorporate physical activity at times into other subjects such as Maths, English and the Wider Curriculum.</li><li>• To improve staff confidence in teaching and delivering a wider range of PE sessions e.g. lacrosse, tri-golf and other less known sports</li></ul>

This partnership gives us huge benefits towards all indicators: with guidance from the CSET coordinator, we monitor and improve on our "heat map" for physical activity on a daily basis; we have attended over 30 competitive competitions, most of which are celebrated on our social media pages to raise the profile of PE; 10 coaching hours for in-house CPD are given; and general CPD, latest initiatives are shared on a weekly basis allowing us to network with nearby schools.
