Spotlight on Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)

At Parkwall Primary School, the safety and wellbeing of our pupils is our top priority. This month's safeguarding bulletin focuses on raising awareness of **Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)** – an issue that can affect children of any age, background, or gender.

What is Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)?

CSE is a form of child abuse. It occurs when a child or young person is manipulated, tricked, or pressured into sexual activity in exchange for things like:

- Gifts, money, or attention
- Drugs or alcohol
- Friendship, affection, or status

Often, children may not realise they are being exploited and may believe they are in a trusting relationship.

Warning Signs to Look Out For

Parents and carers should be alert to changes in behaviour. Possible indicators include:

- Going missing from home or school
- Receiving unexplained gifts, money, or possessions
- Secretive use of mobile phones or online accounts
- Suddenly having older friends or relationships
- Becoming withdrawn, anxious, or distressed
- Changes in appearance or unexplained injuries

Online Safety and CSE

The internet and social media are common tools for exploitation. Please:

- Talk regularly with your child about online safety
 - Check privacy settings on apps and games
 - Encourage your child to share concerns with you or a trusted adult
 - Remind them: never share personal details or photos with strangers online

How We Safeguard at Parkwall Primary

- Staff are trained to recognise signs of CSE and act quickly
 - Children are taught about healthy relationships, consent, and online safety through our curriculum
 - We work closely with local safeguarding partners to keep our pupils safe

What You Can Do

- Keep open, supportive communication with your child
 - Be curious and ask questions about where they go, who they're with, and what they do online
 - Trust your instincts – if something feels wrong, seek advice
